short tail

grayish-blue upper body

black crown

white eyebrow

black eyeline

rusty belly

NORTHERN CARDINAL

short, wide bill

tan body with red streaks

black mask & throat

male

female

red body

BLUE JAY

prominent crest

black necklace

vibrant blue upper body

white chest and belly

black striping through tail

RED-TAILED HAWK

brown head

white throat

red tail

yellow feet & large talons

HOUSE SPARROW

gray crown

short bill

female

male

light brown w/ black streaks

black bib

dark brown with black streaks

NORTHERN FLICKER

red nape

black "whisker"

spotted underside (not pictured)
