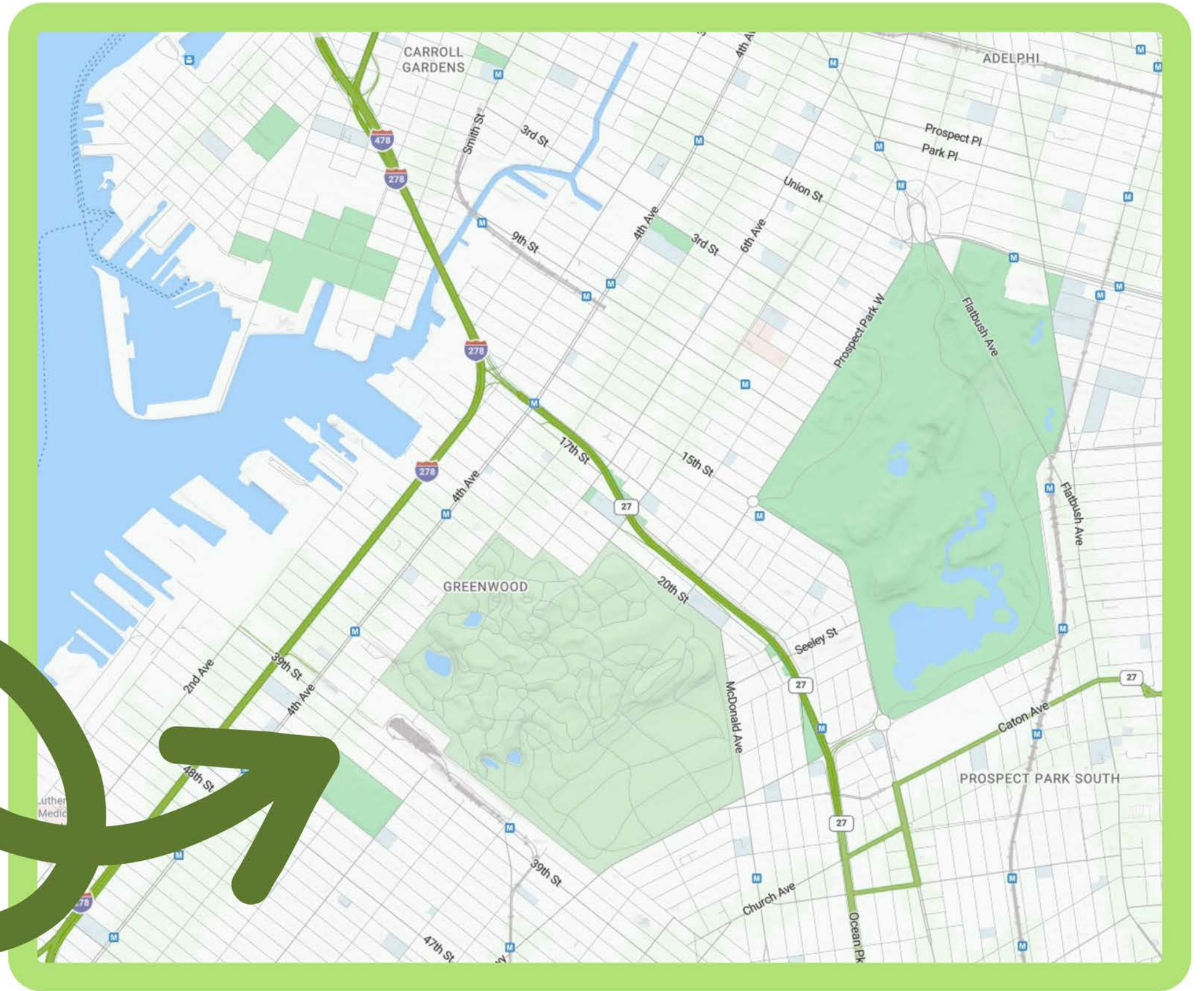


Going To Green-Wood!

Some things you might want to bring to Green-Wood are:



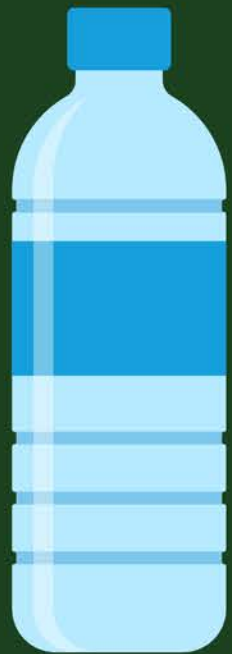
A jacket

Rule: We Respect Nature



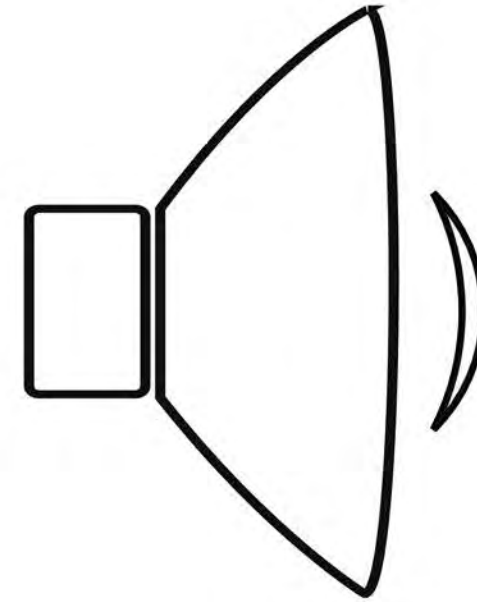
**We keep our bodies calm and
give wildlife lots of space**



**IF an educator says it's ok, you
may touch GENTLY plants.**



Rule: We Respect Other Visitors



**We keeping our voices low in case
people are visiting graves nearby.**



Rule: We Stay Safe Around Grave Monuments



At Green-Wood, people build monuments out of stone to remember loved ones who died. We cannot touch them or things around them. Sometimes they fall down. It is not safe to touch them.



Rule: We Move Around Safely



We stay with the group



It's ok to sit on the grass



We walk on the side of the road



Rule: We Stay Safe on the Trolley



You might travel around the cemetery on the Greenwood Trolley. Stay seated on the trolley and listen to the driver and educator.



**Rule: We will NOT eat or taste
anything during the tour.**



At Green-Wood you CAN

- **Gently touch anything your educator says is ok to touch**
- **Explore and learn**
- **Stay with your group**
- **Walk and sit on the grass**
- **Listen to your classmates and teachers**



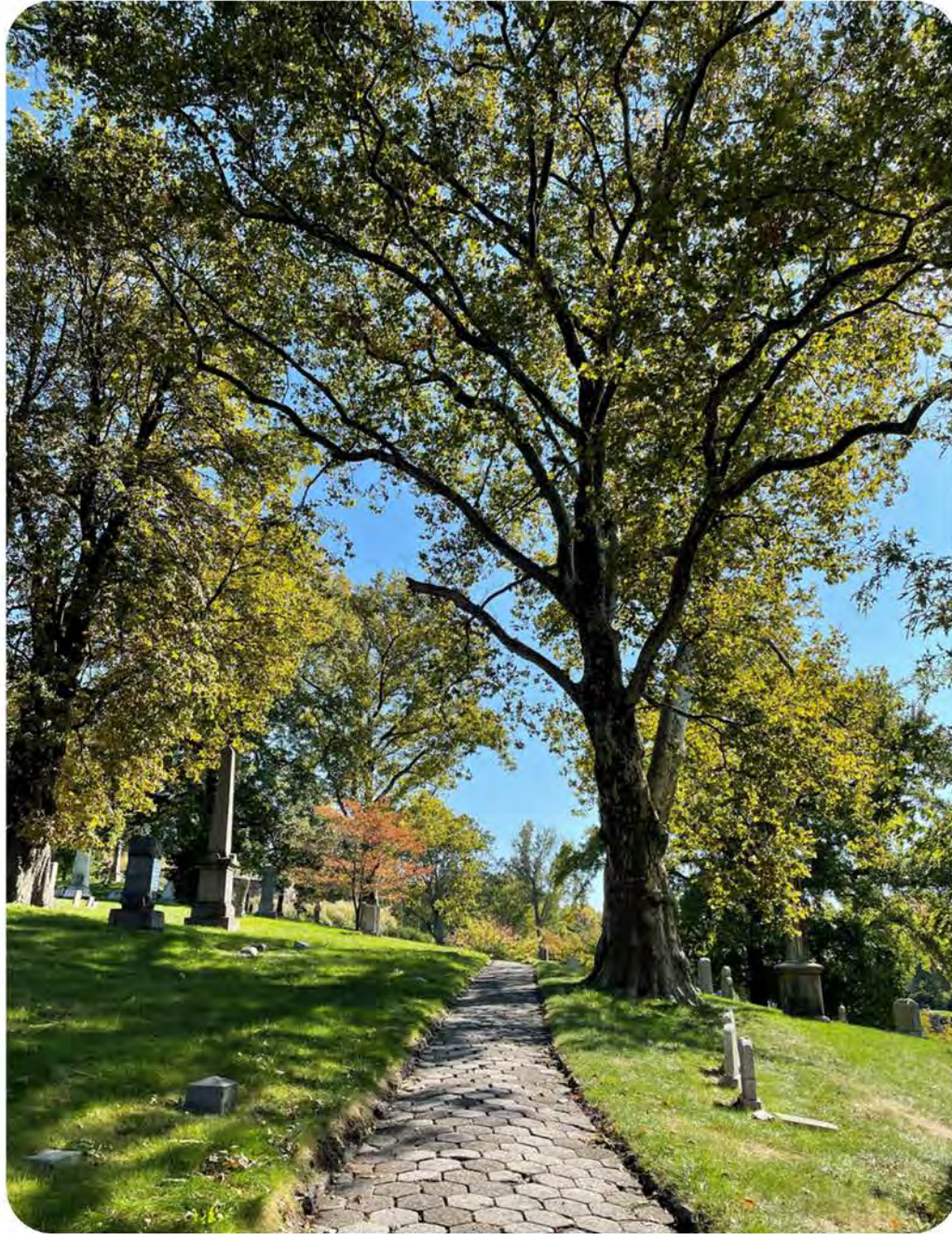
At Green-Wood you CANNOT

- **Touch monuments**
- **Go near animals**
- **Rip out leaves or grass**
- **Leave the group**





After explaining the rules, your Green-Wood educator will take you on a tour. This tour will be outside.

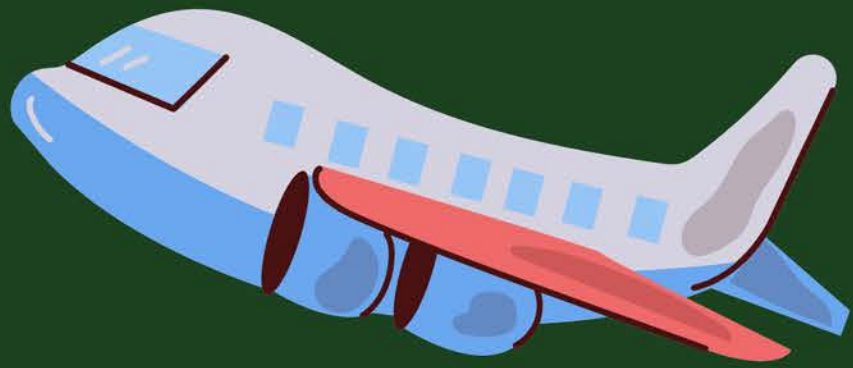


You will walk around the cemetery. The cemetery has lots of hills and roads. Listen to your educator so that you're walking in safe places.

Dirt



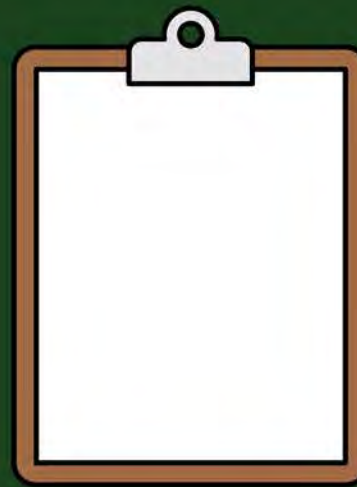
